Introduction & Methodology

From August 6th to 12th, 2024, DHM Research conducted a hybrid survey of young Oregonians. The purpose of the survey was to understand young Oregonians' voting habits and opinions on a variety of topics prior to the upcoming 2024 presidential election.

Research Methodology

The hybrid survey consisted of 600 Oregonians ages 18-40 and took approximately 15 minutes to complete. This is a sufficient sample size to assess young Oregonians' opinions generally and to review findings by multiple subgroups, including age, gender, party, race, education, and area of the state.

Respondents were contacted from multiple lists including a list of registered voters; a landline household list compiled from public records and consumer lists; and a cellular consumer list based off of cell and cable consumer information matched to publicly available address information. Telephone respondents were contacted by a live interviewer and text-to-online respondents received a text invitation directing them to an online survey. In gathering responses, a variety of quality control measures were employed, including questionnaire pre-testing and validation. Quotas were set by age, gender, party, race, education, and area of the state to ensure a representative sample.

Statement of Limitations

Any sampling of opinions or attitudes is subject to a margin of error. The margin of error is a standard statistical calculation that represents differences between the sample and total population at a confidence interval, or probability, calculated to be 95%. This means that there is a 95% probability that the sample taken for this study would fall within the stated margin of error if compared with the results achieved from surveying the entire population. The margin of error for this survey is +/- 4.0%.
